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#### PRACTICAL USES


You can apply idea map sketchnotes to many areas of work and personal life. Here are a few ways they can be useful:

#### \*WRITING

Creating a visual map of the ideas you're working with can aid in the process of writing an article, book, or other material. Research and reference materials are typically spread out across pages or in computer files. Sometimes ideas are lost within large quantities of text. Converting information into a visual idea map lets you see how these varied elements interconnect.



THIAGO ESSER, Interaction/UX designer, uses sketchnotes to remind himself that a developer thinks quite differently than the user.





#### **★PRESENTATIONS**


Diagramming your presentation with an idea map on index cards or sticky notes is helpful in the early stages of presentation preparation.

On the first pass, get your main ideas down so you can see the flow.














On your second pass, realign elements to improve the presentation's flow.
